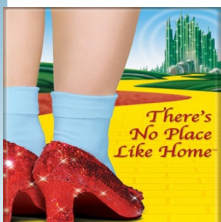

Children's Summer Reading Program is preparing for sign ups and the start of an exciting program! The theme this year will be Read, Renew, and Repeat, which will encourage recycling and nature conservation and awareness. Sign-ups will be from **June 4th-15th** (roughly two weeks), and bi-weekly **check-ins starting the week of June 18th**.



What does the program offer? Themed story time and in-library activities, take-home crafts, performances at the Sheridan City Park (magician, dance group, & puppeteer), gift incentives at each check-in, free books at performances, and a Grand Prize Raffle at our **End of Summer Reading Party on Aug 17th**!

We recently made contact with a representative of the **Yamhill County Enrichment Society** who gave us information and registration cards for the **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library**! After signing up, children will receive one free quality picture book a month, up until their 5th birthday! Registration forms can be found at the front desk and mailed to the address provided on the card. Books are sent according to age and reading level, and addressed in the child's name. 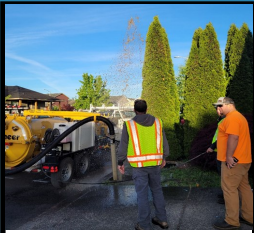

PW responds to a water leak at 6 a.m.

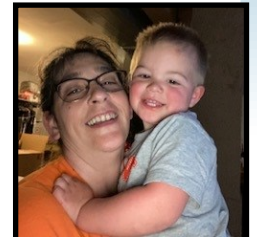
Cooling Center at the Park—Plans are being finalized for our Cooling Center at the City Park! Which means the sprinklers will be turned on from 1-3 p.m. when temps exceed 90°.

Parks—The Southside Park Grant Project is in full swing and has been very much an “all-hands-on-deck” approach! The new bathroom construction is underway, with plumbing stubbed in and concrete for the foundation has been poured. Locations have been set for 3 vendor stalls and a site for a full-time Park Host. In the City Park the grass is growing faster than we can cut it! The proposed parking lot for the Downtown and Morgan Street Park has been cleaned up after demolishing the hold brick building. All the debris has been hauled off.

Streets—a new set of street signs has been installed on Monroe & Morgan Streets and a sidewalk project for the 400 block of SW Jefferson Street has been finalized.

Meet Your City Employee! Sandy Davis, Public Works (PW) Office Clerk

Sandy Davis (pictured right), has worked for the City for the last six months and is our newest permanent employee. She actually worked the same position 18 years ago before moving out of the area. Code Enforcement Focus—Vaccinations & Microchips for Sheridan’s Furry Residents

The City of Sheridan is taking proactive steps to ensure the health & safety of our beloved pet community. This initiative underscores the importance of vaccinations in safeguarding pets against a range of dangerous and potentially fatal diseases. Vaccinations serve as a shield, protecting pets from illnesses like parvo, rabies, distemper, and panleukopenia. These diseases are not only a threat to unvaccinated pets but also pose a risk to humans. By adhering to the American Animal Hospital Association's (AAHA) guidelines, pet owners can ensure their furry friends receive core vaccines, as well as additional ones tailored to their lifestyle, thereby preventing the spread of these preventable diseases.

Microchipping, a simple and quick procedure, involves implanting a tiny chip beneath the pet's skin, offering a permanent solution to pet identification. This technology significantly increases the chances of pets being reunited with their owners if they ever get lost. According to studies, microchipped pets have a significantly higher rate of being returned to their owners compared to non-microchipped ones. This is a crucial step in pet care, providing peace of mind to pet owners and ensuring the swift return of lost pets to their homes.

A future affordable vaccination and microchip clinic in Sheridan represents a critical milestone in community pet care. Pet owners are encouraged to participate in this initiative, safeguarding their pets’ health, and ensuring they are identifiable through microchipping. More details about the clinic will be shared at a future date; residents are urged to stay tuned. This effort is a testament to Sheridan’s commitment to creating a safer and healthier environment for both pets and their owners.
