Sheriff Svenson will be at the next Council meeting, Monday October 1st at 7 pm.

Yard signs for the political season are starting to appear. Just a reminder that political signs (or any signs) cannot be placed on city property or in the rights-of-way (ROW). The ROW includes electric poles and traffic control devices (i.e., stop signs) so signs are prohibited on them. Most people do not know their property boundary line from the ROW boundary line; therefore, it is best to keep any sign on the house side of the sidewalk or a distance back from the roadway. Political signs on private property are not regulated but should not be placed on private property without the owner's permission.

Because of the assistance from the Park and Recreation committee members, the Seed to Supper class starts tomorrow (Saturday) at the Odd Fellows Hall. The Sheridan Japanese Charter School is also using the Seed to Supper format for an elective this semester at their school.

There was a retirement ceremony for Sue Cain at the FCI today. She officially retires on September 30th.

The letters informing contractors of the Notice of Intent to Award the Contract for the East Main Street Waterline Improvement was mailed September 17th. There were no appeals to the intent to award the contract. Murraysmith, our engineering firm, is preparing the contract documents for the city attorney's review.

The work on the fishing pond is moving ahead. The path has been cut in. They are testing the trail's surface material.
