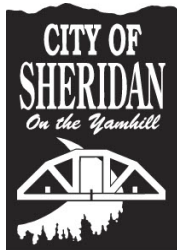

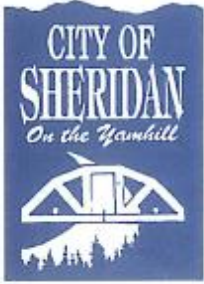

RESOURCE CENTER OVERVIEW

What are the goals of this project?

To connect the community of Sheridan to quality resources and services for families and individuals experiencing houselessness and economic difficulties. The goal is to create a local facility to host a variety of service representatives from Yamhill County organizations and non-profits.

Which resources will be included?

Representation would include a wide range of support services to help families raise healthy children and guide individuals seeking a path to self-sufficiency. Examples may include childcare assistance, family service workers, drug and alcohol treatment and counseling, mental health programs, educational programs, job preparedness classes, and access to public health services. Services represented may also include housing, energy services, access to food, youth services, senior services, child/spouse/elder abuse prevention, and others.

What are the specific expected outcomes of this project?

Partner with Yamhill County service providers, non-profits, and other organizations to complete a plan to improve resource access for Sheridan residents through education about available services, assisting with paperwork, arranging appointments in McMinnville, and advising of available transportation.

Steps to include:

- Develop a plan and design for a “one stop” resource center by renovating an existing structure.
- Work with other service providers to implement a team approach to helping families and individuals.
- Discuss funding and grant writing.

Major benefits of a local resource center:

- Remove barriers to effective services available locally and through Yamhill County. Resource information would be more easily found in a “one stop” Sheridan location.
- Improve quality and quantity of services through greater collaboration and a team approach.
- Reduce costs for providing services by sharing equipment, support staff, and a shared facility.

Questions to be answered before developing a resource center:

- Coordination– which programs should be represented in the center?
- Renovate existing facilities on city property or at Grand Sheramina Food Bank?
- Renovation costs – how much, funding sources?
- Sustainability – how much will it cost to operate?
- Feasibility – is a center really needed, really affordable?
- Leadership - who will operate the building, pay the bills (water, electricity, garbage, maintenance, etc.)?

Tasks:

- Inventory existing service providers and facilities in Sheridan. (See list included in packet.)
- Make a list of potential services providers willing to participate.
- Evaluate pros and cons of specific sites.
- Determine hours and days of operation.
- Determine possible schedules for resource representatives - weekly, monthly, hours, etc.
- Office layout - confidential meeting area, reception area, restrooms, number of desks, computers, shared office equipment, childcare, etc.
- Sketch preliminary concept design of the facility.
- Present updates to the Sheridan City Council.
- Schedule a town hall discussion to determine community support for the project.

POINT-IN-TIME HOMELESS COUNT

The nationwide Point In Time (PIT) Homeless Count takes place annually on the last Wednesday in January. This effort offers a snapshot of homelessness by recording the number of people in an emergency shelter or who are unsheltered *on a single night of the year*.

The surveys are completed with those who are living outside, with more than one family in a household, in a vehicle, in shelters, or motels. YCAP additionally counts those couch surfing, and living with family or friends in a temporary status. This information is used to plan local and national service delivery to at-risk populations.

YCAP leads the count in Yamhill County, collecting information anonymously while connecting individuals with services they may need. Surveys are conducted in several ways, including by phone calls through 211, county-wide drop-in sites, and county-wide street outreach. The most recent survey was conducted on January 29, 2020.

Data is provided by household type (individuals, families, and child-only households), and is further broken down by sub-population categories, such as homeless veterans and the chronically homeless.

Services currently offered in Sheridan:

Grand Sheramina Food Bank (YCAP) weekly food distribution

Grand Sheramina - provides food for Legion lunches and student take-home bags.

Calvary Chapel West Valley - weekly food distribution

Churches United - weekly student take-home lunches (for three-day weekends)

Churches United - brown bag lunch distribution

American Legion - hot lunches twice per week (schedule needed)

Head Start - Sheridan

A Family Place - Willamina - free diapers, parenting classes, etc.

Free Yamhill County Transit bus service - weekdays

Current emergency programs include peer counseling, food and meal distribution, court advocacy, mental health and substance abuse treatment referrals, free health care referrals, emergency shelter, gas and transportation vouchers, laundry vouchers, and safe overnight car camping.
